

# 2013 Expository Writing Syllabus

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## Introduction and Class Objectives

Welcome to Expository Writing! I'm excited to serve as your instructor, and look forward to teaching you.

This course will provide you with the opportunity to study expository writing in all its forms – essays, journalism, etc. – as well as get into the technical details regarding what writing is, and what it means to become a writer. Students will be challenged, as well as be asked to challenge themselves, and the six-week course will present each one with a variety of opportunities to expand his/her writing repertoire.

## Materials

The following materials are mandatory:

- At least one journal/notebook of at least 70 pages
- Pens of various visible colors – at least 2 different colors (I suggest black and blue!) – and pencils

## Class Guidelines and Student Expectations

I expect my students to demonstrate maturity, honesty, consistency, and dependability, and I also expect you to demand this level of behavior from me. I will treat you with respect, speak honestly and clearly, take the time to provide assistance when needed, and try my best to listen, understand, and get to know you on an individual basis. I will also give you room to grow and experiment, provide you with honest critique whenever possible, and provide you with an enjoyable learning community.

I expect my students to conduct themselves responsibly and respectfully in class. This extends beyond your interactions with me; I expect you to treat your classmates well. I expect you to earn everything you receive, to ask questions and seek answers with curiosity (and without fear), to concentrate on this class in this classroom, to challenge yourself, and to do the little things – like learning your classmates' names.

Finally, please arrive to class punctually and prepared to participate!

## Grading Philosophy

Each student receives a grade at the end of each week. All grades are **pre-curved**. That is to say that I have directed my gradebook software to round an 89.7% to an A- and to leave an 89.3% as a B+. I will not round grades myself; I consider a 90% to be an A-, and the computer is in charge of rounding when appropriate. Do not ask for a higher grade than you have received, as it will not be given. If a grade is unclear, please discuss it with me when appropriate.

Also, those who seek to earn an A will be given every opportunity to do so. However, students must do more than simply complete work in order to earn such a grade; an A denotes excellence, and "A students" must demonstrate a willingness to create and to challenge themselves on a consistent basis.
